Much the way the Red Cross rescues those in distress, HP offers customers a way to protect themselves when needed. The use of the red cross is a universal symbol for aid, and the shield is a common shape used to denote coverage or protection. By using these visual symbols together we can have an easily understood icon.

The associated text emphasizes this point of hardware insurance rather than phone operator assistance or maintenance, which ties in nicely with the icon symbolism
